October- Students will be introduced to 4-H. They will learn the roles and responsibilities of the following officer positions: President, Vice President, Secretary, Reporter/Historian and Song Leader. Students will understand the importance of leadership and experience democratic processes by nominating and voting for their peers.

November- Students will learn the ten types of paralanguage (pitch, volume, tone, articulation, speed, stress patterns, vocal quality, rhythm, road blocks and pauses). The 4-H Agent will demonstrate a dramatic reading excerpt. Students will be asked to prepare a dramatic reading selection to present at the December 4-H Club Meeting.

December- Students will present a dramatic reading selection to their classmates. Teachers may choose to grade these presentations.

January- The 4-H Agent will provide feedback and ribbons based on individual performance from the December 4-H Dramatic Reading Competition. Students will participate in a STEM activity.

February- Students will learn how to do a Presentation/Demonstration. Presentations/ Demonstrations will follow an essay outline. The importance of having an introduction, body, and summary will be highlighted.

March- Presentation/Demonstrations will be given on topics of student's interest. Teachers may choose to grade these reports.

April- Students will celebrate their 4-H accomplishments and learn about additional hands-on experiential learning 4-H activities that they can participate in during the summer.

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


