
Students in Ms. Hiatt and Mr. King's Class participated in a 3 day "Real Life" program. The goals and objectives of this program are listed above. The main topics covered included Career Exploration, Economic Education and a "Real Life" Simulation. Students were given a pre-test and post-test to measure their knowledge before and after participating in this hands-on program.

More students were excited about their future job after completing the program.

Pre-test results determined that **73.3%** of students understood what minimum wage was and 38.6% of respondents knew how to determine their monthly income.

After completing the program, 82.9% of respondents knew what minimum wage was and

**87.8%** of students understood how to determine their monthly income. More students knew how to write a check and felt confident in their ability to balance a

checkbook after participating in this program. Pre and post test results are given side by side in the pie charts above.

**82.9%** of respondents feel prepared to handle their own money in the future.

**36.6%** of participants planned to talk to their parents about the program.

**86.6%** of students learned something new while participating in the "Real Life" program.



- More students were excited about their future job.










































**90 students completed the pre and post test.** Of these students, 84.4% reported learning something new and 40% plan to talk about the Real Life program with their guardians.

Pre-test results determined that **70%** of students understood what minimum wage was and **44.4%** of respondents knew how to determine their monthly income.

After completing the program, **90%** of respondents knew what minimum wage was and **80%** of students understood how to determine their monthly income.
